Cloud Looms Over Town...Chief Leaves

On January 23 the normal Lady Lake commission was called to order and the floor was opened to public discussion. Before anyone from the public could respond, Commissioner Hannon asked for the floor. Mayor Richardsons said it was highly unusual but gave approval. Commissioner Hannon said he was saddened that Chief McKinstry quit. He said he had heard from many constituents asking him to do all he could to rehire the Chief.

Betty Salas then approached the podium with a petition of 168 names requesting the Chief be reinstated. Ms Salas also said that she knew the previous chief and that when the commission hired chief she was assured he was the right man for Lady Lake. She got to know him as did the businesses and residents of Lady Lake as well.

Town Manager Kris Kollgaard then read a statement that said she and the Chief have had professional differences in management styles for the last 6 years and that this was the last time. She contact the commissioners the night before and said the morning meeting would have only one of 2 outcomes. Up until this meeting the general public was told no one at town hall knew why the Chief quit, just that he did. Now we are finding out the

After the statement was read by Town Manager Kollgaard, Commissioner Vincent challenged her management skills, saying she shows favoritism, and micro manages all departments, gives raises to those she likes and not to our police force, and called for her resignation. Kris Kollgaard response was "Go For It". Of course this created a stir among the commissioners as they had to see if they could even discuss this or if a special meeting had to be scheduled.

The next public comment was made by Phil Mathias who said he had spoken to 8





officers who have quit working at Lady Lake and the reason they left was due to the low pay scales and no other reason. Kollgaard tried to interrupt. Mathias was not letting her, saying he had the floor and it was his turn to talk. Phil then looked Kris in the eye and said "Kris it is time for you to go!"

The commissioners then discussed what they would have to talk to ex-town employees, officers and the Chief and that they felt the problem stemmed from different management styles and that the town charter allows the Town Manager to hire and fire all her employees without the commissioners' say so.

Public opinion is that the residents do not want to lose Chief and now it appears that one issue has turned into 2. Can Chief come back? Is Kris' management style still good for the town?

I believe there is a way out of this!

First, put the Lady Lake Police Department under the Town Council. Keep the Town Manger under the Town Council on an equal levels.

Second, review their Job descriptions, describing what you expect of them! Then review the complaints from past employees about being micro managed and work with the Town Manager to tweak her management style. There are training seminars that could help!

Betty Salas, left, a local business person standing up for Chief McKinstry, is holding a petition of 166 names of residents asking the Town Council to consider reinstating him. The meeting that followed blew everyone away. It was so much that a second meeting was set to discuss the issue and to discuss reviewing the Ex-Chief and Town Manager Kollgard's actions. Florida's Support of Israel

Actions to Affirm Florida's Support of

Boca Raton, Fla. – Today, surrounded by a group of bipartisan legislators and faith leaders, Governor Ron DeSantis announced several actions his administration is taking to affirm Florida's steadfast support of the State of Israel. At the event hosted by the Jewish Federation of South Palm Beach County, Governor DeSantis outlined three major steps Florida will take to stand with

"Florida is the most Israel-friendly state in the country and we will not stand for discrimination against the Israeli people of any kind," said Governor Ron DeSantis. "By calling for increased security for our Jewish Day Schools, punishing companies that participate in the Boycott, Divestment and Sanctions (BDS) movement and taking my first trade mission to Israel, the Israeli People can be assured that they have no greater friend than Florida. BDS is nothing more than a cloak for anti-Semitism, and as long as I'm Governor, BDS will be DOA. I cannot wait to strengthen the already unwavering bond between Florida and the great state of Israel."

Governor DeSantis is calling for a minimum of \$2 million in recurring funding for security for Jewish Day Schools. Following the tragic anti-Semitic attack in Pittsburg in October 2018, Floridians should feel assured that students and staff are safe at Jewish Day Schools throughout the state. Parents should not feel worried about sending their children to a specific school based on their faith and Governor DeSantis looks forward to working with the Legislature on this important issue.

Governor DeSantis wrote a letter instructing the Department of Management Services (DMS) to prohibit state workers and contractors from being reimbursed for official travel expenses incurred through the services of vacation rental company Airbnb. On November 19, 2018, Airbnb issued a statement outlining a policy that would no longer allow the rental of approximately 200 listing in Israeli settlements in the West Bank, a clear discrimination against the Israeli people. In addition to the Governor's letter, the State Board of Administration (SBA) is reviewing whether Airbnb should be placed on the scrutinized company list. Once the review is completed, they will issue a report to SBA Trustees Governor DeSantis, Attorney General Ashley Moody and CFO Jimmy Patronis.

Governor DeSantis also wrote a letter to Florida Division of Emergency Management (DEM) Director Jared Moskowitz to ensure hurricane disaster survivors will not be impacted by this Airbnb directive.

Additionally, Governor DeSantis announced that his first international trade mission will be to the State of Israel, keeping a promise made during his campaign for Governor. The trip will take place after the Legislative Session in May, and members of both parties in the Florida House and Florida Senate will be invited. The focus of the trip will be to expand commercial ties between Florida and Israel as well as to learn from innovative research from Israeli scientists to combat issues facing Florida such as red tide.

Sweet Potato Chili

California Sweet Potato Chili

Serves 6

2 Toil

1 lb ground beef, turkey, chicken or pork

Salt and pepper

1 onion, diced

1 red bell pepper, diced

3 cloves garlic, minced

2 T chili powder

1 T smoked paprika

1 tsp ground coriander

1 tsp ground cumin

1 tsp dried oregano

1/4 tsp ground cayenne pepper

1/4 tsp ground cinnamon

2 14.5-oz cans diced tomatoes

2 c low-sodium chicken or vegetable broth

2 15-oz cans kidney or pinto beans (with their juices)

1½ lb orange- or yellow-fleshed sweet potatoes, or a combination, diced

In large saucepan or small stockpot over medium-high, warm 1 T oil. Add meat and cook until brown. Add salt and pepper, transfer to bowl, set aside. Return to mediumhigh. Add 1 Toil. Add onion and bell pepper, cook until crisp-tender, 2 minutes. Add garlic, spices, and 1 tsp salt and cook, stirring, 1 minute. Add remaining ingredients. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat. Simmer until sweet potatoes are tender, 25 to 30 minutes.

Bay County, Fla. – Today, Governor Ron De Santis and Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Administrator Brock Long visited local communities in the Florida Panhandle that were heavily impacted by Hurricane Michael. Stops included Panama City, Mexico Beach and Port St. Joe.

Governor DeSantis and Administrator Long, along with Florida Chief Financial Officer Jimmy Patronis and Florida Division of Emergency Management Director Jared Moskowitz, also received a full briefing on recovery efforts at the Calhoun County Emergency Operations Center.

"Today marks my second trip to the Panhandle since taking office. Hurricane Michael may be gone but the emergency remains," said Governor Ron DeSantis. "We thank Administrator Long for recognizing the recovery effort is far from over. We will continue to work diligently with our federal, state and local partners to support Florida families as they rebuild."

"I am also pleased to announce that we are providing \$2.8 million in matching funds for debris removal in Mexico Beach.

Mexico Beach is ground zero for hurricane recovery and we will never stop fighting for Floridians that need our support."



Tips For Finding Good Nutrition



(NAPSI)—According to the U.S. Department of Agriculture, one out of every eight U.S. households experiences food insecurity. Access to healthy food is an important factor in your health, and for millions of Americans, it remains elusive.

Some grocery stores also offer cooking demonstrations. Some supermarket companies specialize in offering products, programs and services that better meet the needs of people with limited financial resources. At the very least, large grocery stores offer a much wider variety of fresh produce, whole grains and other healthy foods than are often available in small neighborhood stores.

Many low-income communities lack such grocery stores, and people without their own transportation may have difficulty accessing healthy food sources. Medicaid enrollees who are eligible for home and community-based services (HCBS) can get transportation for nonmedical services such as grocery shopping. Senior citizens may also be able to access paratransit services. Medicaid enrollees who are covered by a managed care plan but don't qualify for HCBS or senior citizen services can check with their health plan to see what resources might be available.

Organizations in the Community

If your challenge is less about finding sources of healthy food than getting to them, there are options that can help you shop for groceries, or even do it completely on your behalf. There are also food banks, some of which have off-site distributions, even in

rural areas. If you are a senior citizen, you can find out about them by contact?ing your area agency on aging.


Look for Faith-Based Groups

About Cholesterol



(NAPSI)—New cholesterol guidelines from the American Heart Association emphasize a personalized approach to preventing and treating high cholesterol and cardiovascular disease.

What Cholesterol Is

Cholesterol is a waxy substance that your body makes to build cells. Too much can pose a problem. Extra cholesterol comes from foods including meat, poultry, dairy and tropical oils.

Why Cholesterol Matters

Cholesterol can slowly build up in your arteries and form a thick, hard deposit that narrows them and makes them less flexible. If a blood clot blocks a narrowed artery, a heart attack or stroke can result.

What To Do

Ask your doctor such questions as:

Q. What do cholesterol numbers mean?

A. Studies suggest optimal cholesterol levels are about 150 mg/dL and about 100 mg/dL for low-density lipoprotein cholesterol (LDL-C). Levels in this range are linked to lower rates of heart disease and stroke.

There's no ideal target for LDL-C but "lower is better." Assessment with a risk calculator helps your doctor determine your personal risk and treatment options. A coronary artery calcium test may also help with your assessment.

Q. How can I lower my risk for heart disease?

A. A healthy lifestyle is critical. Also, while statins are still the first choice of medication for lowering cholesterol, new drugs are available for people who have had a heart attack or stroke and are at risk for another. Your doctor will monitor your progress.

Q. How do I know if my medicine is working?

A. It may take a few tries to find the right medicine and dose.

"Finding the sweet spot for treatment is highly individualized," said Donald Lloyd-Jones, M.D., a member of the cholesterol guideline writing committee and chair of the Department of Preventive Medicine at Northwestern University in Chicago. "The latest guidelines strongly encourage patient

MARION COUNTY, Florida (January 18, 2019) - On Tuesday, January 15, 2019, Marion County Sheriff's Office (MCSO) Major Crimes detectives arrested and charged 16-year old Luis Ortega (DOB: 09/19/2002) with First Degree Premeditated Murder for the homicide of 18-year old Brandon Hammett (DOB: 04/27/2000). Hammett was shot and killed by Ortega during an attempted robbery on October 26, 2018.

On Friday, October 26th, at approximately 6:30 p.m., multiple MCSO deputies and Ocala Police Department officers responded to the area of 3200th block of SW 43rd Court in reference to a shooting. When units arrived on scene, they found Hammett in a vehicle suffering from gunshot wounds. He was transported to the hospital, where he later passed away from his injuries.


MCSO Major Crimes detectives conducted a thorough investigation and discovered that Dalton Purvis (DOB: 06/10/1999), felt that he had been cut short on the last batch of marijuana Hammett sold him. Purvis gathered Denver Sutter (DOB: 11/22/1999) and

Carlos Flores-Renteria (DOB: nobond.


FIRST DEGREE MURDER IN plan with them to rob Hammett. Purvis also asked if Flores-Renteria could invite Ortega to come along, because he knew Ortega had a gun. Purvis, Sutter and Flores-Renteria told detectives that they intended on Ortega's presence to serve for security and intimidation purposes.

> The four suspects then met Hammett at the incident location in order to "buy more marijuana." However, when Hammett arrived, the suspects told Hammett to hand over everything he had to them. According to suspects' statements, it was at this time when Hammett put his vehicle in reverse in an attempt to flee the scene. Ortega then shot Hammett while he was backing up.

> Purvis, Sutter and Flores-Renteria were arrested and charged with Felony Murder in the days following the shooting. A grand jury was convened on Tuesday, January 15, 2019, and a grand jury indicted Ortega for the charge of First Degree Premediated Murder and later that same day, Ortega was located and arrested for the grand jury's warrant. During his interview with detectives on Tuesday, Ortega confessed to shooting and killing Hammett. Ortega is currently being held in the Marion County Jail on

and doctor to have detailed and personalized discussions about medication."

Ask your doctor about medicines, foods—such as grapefruit or pomegranate—or supplements that may interact with your cholesterol-lowering medication.

Q. When and how often should I follow n?

A. Have a follow-up visit one to three months after starting cholesterol-lowering medication to check that it's working, that you're taking it properly, and to monitor for side effects.

Whisk in butter and sliced green onions. Serve immediately. Top with additional green onions for garnish if desired.

If you like shorter egg pieces in your soup, whisk more quickly when adding the egg. If you like longer ribbons, stir very slowly when adding.
