## Death Warrant

Death Warrant for Robert Joseph Long The attached letter was transmitted on April 23, 2019 to Warden Barry Reddish of Florida State Prison, pertaining to Robert Joseph Long, who was sentenced to death for the 1984 murder of Michelle Simms.

On or about May 27, 1984, Long approached Simms, and she entered his car. Long drove Simms to a remote location, forced her to undress at knife point, and tied her to the car seat. Long then raped Simms and attempted to strangle her. When his attempts failed, he hit her head with a club

give up their bankroll? If you do I have a and pushed her from the car. Long slit her throat and left her on the side of the road to die. Deputies from the Hillsborough County Sheriff's Office found Simms's nude body. Her face was bloodied, her hands and body were tied, and she suffered rope burns on her neck and chin. Fibers located near her body matched fibers found in Long's car.

Long confessed to murdering Simms after he was apprehended for the kidnapping and sexual battery of Lisa McVey in November 1984. In addition to confessing to Simms's murder, Long admitted to killing eight other women in Hillsborough and Pasco Counties. He also claimed to have raped approximately 40 women in three different states. Long eventually pled guilty to eight homicides, and he received a sentence of death for murdering Simms.

The execution date has been set for Thursday, May 23, 2019, at 6:00 PM EST.

# 29,000 Hospital Deaths Each Year

\$10.2 Billion and Contribute to Nearly 29,000 Hospital Deaths Each Year

But new technology can dramatically curb the pressure ulcer pandemic

(NAPSI)—American healthcare, renowned for pioneering new technology to save lives, has all but ignored one of the most costly and deadly Hospital-Acquired Conditions (HACs), which the federal government defines as preventable patient injuries.

While the number of other HACs has decreased by 8 percent, pressure ulcers have been resistant to improvement efforts. They continue to grow by 10 percent annually.

Pressure ulcers are both costly and deadly. The U.S. Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality (AHRQ) reports that pressure ulcers add \$10.2 billion to U.S. healthcare costs. As the chart above shows, pressure ulcers are associated with more than 45 percent of the nation's 63,619 HAC-related deaths and are the leading contributor to HAC-related deaths.

#### Costly, deadly problem

Averaging the impact among the nation's 5,534 hospitals means that each will treat more than 127 pressure ulcers, write off

Pressure Ulcers Cost U.S. Healthcare more than \$1.8 million in unreimbursed treatment costs and see more than five pressure ulcer patients die every vear.

> Medicine has wrestled with the problem of pressure ulcers for generations. Their prevention relies on physically moving or turning a patient at frequent intervals to relieve pressure on different parts of the body. Unfortunately, turning a patient can slip on the priority list of busy hospital staff.

> Technology that monitors patient movement and notifies nurses when a patient needs to be turned exists and is available throughout the United States. Dozens of studies presented in public medical forums demonstrate that a wearable patient-monitoring technology helps hospitals prevent pressure ulcers, reduce their medical costs and save lives. These studies all monitored patients at risk for pressure ulcers using the Leaf Patient Monitoring System, the only system on the market designed exclusively to help providers prevent pressure ulcers.

> One randomized trial of more than 1,200 patients at a large California academic medical center concluded that the pressure ulcer incidence rate was 74 percent lower among patients monitored by the wearable monitoring system.

Tech can save lives, money

Applying the same rate of reduction to the national problem, the deployment of wearable technology could save more than 21,000 lives and nearly \$7.5 billion in unreimbursed healthcare costs each year. For the average hospital, that would mean \$1.36 million in annual savings.

Technology can help our understaffed clinical teams reduce the risk of very preventable pressure ulcers. For the sake of our patients' well-being-and our healthcare institutions' financial stability-we need to seriously consider the benefits new technology can provide.

Margaret Doucette, D.O. is chief of Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation at the Boise VA Medical Center, where she oversees wound prevention and care efforts. The founder and former medical director of the Elks/St. Luke's Wound Care Center and a co-founder of the Idaho Pressure Ulcer Prevention Coalition, Dr. Doucette has been instrumental in developing wound care programs across the continuum of care in Idaho. The 2017 Tax Cut and Jobs Act created opportunity zone investments and tax benefits for those investing in them. While this sounds good—use the income tax code to help bring investments to needy areas-- it is really designed to bribe higher income people.

This <u>information</u> is provided by the IRS:

- An Opportunity Zone is an economically-distressed community where new investments, under certain conditions, may be eligible for preferential tax treatment. Localities qualify as Opportunity Zones if they have been nominated for that designation by the state and that nomination has been certified by the Secretary of the U.S. Treasury via his delegation of authority to the Internal Revenue Service.
- Opportunity Zones are designed to spur economic development and job creation in distressed communities.
- Opportunity Zones provide tax benefits to investors. First, investors can defer tax on any prior gains invested in a Qualified Opportunity Fund (QOF) until the earlier of the date on which the investment in a QOF is sold or exchanged, or December 31, 2026. If the QOF investment is held for longer than 5 years, there is a 10% exclusion of the deferred gain. If held for more than 7 years, the 10% becomes 15%. Second, if the investor holds the investment in the Opportunity Fund for at least ten years, the investor is eligible for an increase in basis of the QOF investment equal to its fair market value on the date that the OOF investment is sold or exchanged.

WHO INVESTS IN OPPORTUNITY ZONES AND WHAT DO THEY RECEIVE?

The question to ask when you look at gifts from the Swamp and their allies in Congress, like the opportunity zone legislation, is, "Who benefits?" This is an easy answer.

The people who benefit are the people who have made sales of assets and have capital gains. For example, a person selling Apple stock in April of 2019 and receiving a \$10 million capital gain will ordinarily owe approximately \$2 million in U.S. capital gains tax. Then the person will have \$8 million to reinvest.



**STING** MARION COUNTY, Florida (April 9, 2019)- Detectives from the Marion County Sheriff's Office (MCSO) and the Ocala Police Department (OPD) conducted a twoday operation on April  $4^{th}$  and  $5^{th}$  targeting suspects involved in retail theft crimes. 

Custom stainless grids and elegant drain covers and strainers can make prep work more pleasing, cleanup less complicated, and entertaining an event reserved for graciously accepting compliments.

As one kitchen designer put it: "Most clients are particular about aesthetics, but all clients insist on functionality. People want spaces that convey their personality, but most of all want their kitchen to make their lives easier."

In response, Blanco came up with grids that float inside the sink to dry dishes, elevate pots or wash vegetables; colanders and cutting boards that can sit on top of the sink or on a specially engineered ledge to save counter space and make prep work a dream. You have to set the colander inside the sink anyway, while using the cutting board in the sink is a sneaky way to get in more counter space and make the job of prepping easier, too.

"Having a living landscape of grass, trees, shrubs and flowering plants is good. "Getting outside, even for just 10 minutes, can do much to boost your mood, productivity, and quality of life."

**Take a walk.** Lace up your athletic shoes and head out for a walk around the block or to your neighborhood park. While you're out, commit to turning off your cell phone and enjoying the natural setting around you (it's just 10 minutes, after all!).

Get your kids moving. A rousing game of tag or hide-and-seek in the family yard is a great way to counter computer and screen time.



Study or read a book. Take the "work" brea out of homework by moving study or you.




reading sessions to your backyard or community green space.




