
## Naming Supreme Court Justice



## DENNIS K. BAXLEY



The Legislature finished the ninth and final week of the 2016 Session and adjourned Sine Die on Friday, March 11. We spent most of our time on the House floor debating bills and voting on their final

passage, including the state budget and this year's tax cut package.

This year's \$82.3 billion budget is fiscally responsible and prioritizes funding in the best interest of all Floridians. In this budget, we continued to invest in our student's

success by providing a historic level of education funding per student. To help protect our precious natural resources, we included a reliable and dedicated funding source for restoring the Everglades that reaches over \$203 million. This budget also focuses on providing critical health care services to our most vulnerable citizens. In addition, we maintain \$3 billion in reserves, because, in my opinion, government must responsibly plan for the future, just like Florida families must do.

Additionally, the Legislature passed over half a billion dollars in tax cuts this Session. This year's tax cut package will help grow Florida's economy and make our state an even more affordable place to live. These tax

cuts will benefit many Floridians, including homeowners, veterans, students and parents, and more. Some of the major components of the tax cut package include \$428 million in property tax relief for Florida's homeowners, a three-day Back to School sales tax holiday, the elimination of sales tax on purchasing manufacturing equipment, and the elimination of sales tax on food and drink sold to fellow members at veterans organizations. Floridians deserve to keep more of their hard-earned money and can decide how to spend it better than the government.

This session, the Legislature passed bills to address Florida's water quality and supply challenges in a comprehensive, state-

wide manner, increase postsecondary education and employment opportunities for students with intellectual disabilities, and create several programs to help individuals with disabilities achieve economic independence. The House also passed bills to continue our tradition of bold educational reforms, reduce costs and increase access to health care, support our veterans, toughen our anti-corruption laws, create dedicated funding for Everglades restoration, reform our death penalty process to ensure we can still use this sentence against our most violent criminals, and much more. In just a few short weeks, we accomplished a great deal for Florida families.

### MOVE OVER AND MAKE WAY FOR EMERGENCY VEHICLES

Have you ever approached an intersection and heard a siren? Perhaps you have looked in your rear-view mirror and saw flashing lights behind you. Chances are that you have passed an emergency worker or a law enforcement officer who pulled off the roadway with his or her lights flashing. You should be aware that in Florida the law requires that you move over, make way and

slow down when approaching all emergency and law enforcement vehicles stopped on the roadway. The law, known as the Move Over Act, is designed to protect law enforcement officers, firefighters and other emergency workers from needless, accidental tragedy.

After 40 years in law enforcement and public safety, I have learned that driving, especially when responding to calls for service, is the most hazardous duty performed by law enforcement officers, firefighters and emergency service professionals. Many fatalities and injuries to emergency service workers could have been avoided had the driver simply slowed down and moved over.

The Lady Lake Police Department strictly enforces the Move Over Law to help keep

you and all public safety professionals safe. While on the roadway, please be alert, pay attention and remember the following:

If an emergency vehicle is approaching from behind, put on your turn signal, yield to the right-of-way, slow down or pull over. Once the emergency vehicle has passed, use your turn signal and carefully re-enter the roadway.

On a two-lane roadway, you are required to slow to a speed that is 20 miles per hour less than the posted speed limit. If the speed limit is 20 miles per hour or less, you must slow down to five miles per hour.

If you are driving on an interstate or roadway with multiple lanes of travel in the same direction and you approach an emergency or law enforcement vehicle parked along the roadway, you must vacate the lane closest to that vehicle as soon as it is safe to do so.

When arriving at an intersection where an emergency vehicle is approaching from the cross street, come to a complete stop and wait until all emergency vehicles have safely passed before continuing.

If you are a driver who violates the Move Over Law, you can be charged with a moving violation, which results in a fine and points on your license. More importantly, by violating this important law, you would be putting both yourself and a dedicated “first responder” at risk.

On behalf of the men and women of the Lady Lake Police Department, I urge you to help protect those who are sworn to serve and protect you. Always remember to make way, slow down and MOVE OVER when approaching an emergency or law enforcement vehicle - it's the law.

## Prepare Your Air Conditioner For Summer

(NAPSI)—Although the dog days of summer are months away, it's never too soon to begin preparing for them. This includes taking a few simple steps to make sure your air-conditioning system is ready to properly cool your home.

Begin by clearing the area around your outdoor compressor, removing leaves, twigs and other debris that may have accumulated over the winter. The space around and above the unit should be clear and uncluttered.

Next, check the system's filters, typically located along the return duct. Dirty filters can block airflow and reduce system efficiency, so it's important to clean or replace them regularly, preferably every month when the system is operating.

Holes or separated joints in the ductwork can also impact airflow and efficiency, so turn your system on and make sure air is flowing properly through the vents. If you suspect a leak in the ductwork, hire a professional to make the necessary repairs.

Use this time to caulk and weather-strip around doors and windows. This often overlooked step will help keep cool air inside your home during warm summer months and warm air outside.

It's also a good idea to add insulation around air-conditioning ducts when they are located in unconditioned spaces, such as attics, crawl spaces and garages.

Finally, contact a certified technician to do a preseason check of your system. An annual inspection should include the following:

• Clean indoor and outdoor coils

• Check your system's refrigerant charge and adjust it, if necessary, to meet manufacturer specifications

• Clean and adjust blower components to provide proper system airflow

• Lubricate all moving parts

• Inspect the condensate drain for clogs that can cause water damage, affect indoor

humidity levels, and breed bacteria and mold

• Check thermostat settings and system controls to ensure proper and safe operation

• Tighten all electrical connections

• Measure voltage and current on motors

Taking these steps to prepare your air conditioner for summer will also help to extend the life of your system and save you money by detecting small issues before they become major problems.

## Survey Finds Health Care Concerns Americans

(NAPSI)—According to a recent Morning Consult survey, one thing American voters are worried sick about is health care.

The availability and affordability of quality health care services are top concerns among U.S. registered voters, according to the study commissioned by University of Phoenix® College of Health Professions.

### Survey Findings

One-quarter of respondents are uncertain of their access to quality health care services when needed, with 63 percent of Americans expressing concerns about accessing medical facilities, such as hospitals and pharmacies, and 70 percent citing concern about the ability to see a doctor on short notice. The survey also found out-of-pocket expenses to

be a major concern among Americans, with nine in 10 respondents reporting unease about the cost of health care. ## Keep Track of Open Recalls

(NAPSI)—If you’re like most people, car safety and performance are important to you. But you might be surprised to hear that over 47 million vehicles have unfixed safety recalls—vehicles you might be sharing the road with or driving yourself.

Alarming, family-oriented vehicles like SUVs and minivans are the least-often fixed. An auto recall usually occurs when the manufacturer or the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration finds that a car has a defect or fails to meet federal safety standards.

While repeated attempts are made to reach the owners, the stats suggest that people aren’t well-enough informed about recalls, and may not know where to start. To help you stay informed, you can use the free myCarfax.com service to get e-mails or text alerts about current and future recalls on your car.

### In the Kitchen

Clean off the blades of a well-worn can opener with an old toothbrush soaked with vinegar to help remove dirt and grease.

Clean your ice/water dispenser by running vinegar through the system. Flush the vinegar out by running water through the system for 30-60 seconds.

Rid your dishwasher of mineral buildup by pouring half a cup of vinegar into the reservoir and running an empty cycle. You can also use vinegar in the dishwasher instead of another glass cleaner to keep your glassware sparkling.

Renew sponges and dishrags by placing them in just enough water to cover them. Then add one-fourth cup of vinegar and let them soak overnight.

Remove dark stains on an aluminum pot by boiling two cups of vinegar. For stained and smelly plastic food containers and lunchboxes, wipe them with a cloth dampened with vinegar.

To clean a grease-splattered oven door window, saturate it with vinegar. Keep the door open for 10-15 minutes before wiping with a sponge.

Deodorize the garbage disposal by pouring in half a cup of baking soda and half a cup of vinegar. Let sit for five minutes then run hot water down the disposal.

Avoid using toxic chemicals where you store food; wipe up spills in the fridge with vinegar.

### In the Bathroom

Rid a faucet of lime deposits by tying a plastic bag containing one-third to one-half cup of vinegar around it and leaving it there for two or three hours. Wipe down with a sponge and scrub any remaining deposits with an old toothbrush. The same approach can be used to remove buildup on a showerhead.

The fizzing combo of vinegar and baking soda can unclog and remove odor from a tub drain. Pour half a cup of baking soda in the drain, then follow with two cups of hot vinegar. Immediately plug the drain with a rag to keep the bubbles contained for 10 minutes. Rinse by pouring a kettle of boiling hot water down the drain.

Spray shower doors with vinegar after you've squeegeed the glass - or before you turn on the water - to help release hard water deposits.

Clean shower door tracks by filling them

with vinegar and letting it sit for a few hours. Pour hot water into the tracks and scrub away any remaining film with a toothbrush.

To make the toilet bowl sparkle, pour in a cup or more of vinegar and let it sit for several hours or overnight. Scrub well with the toilet brush and flush.

Remove old bathtub decals with vinegar heated in the microwave.

In the Laundry Room

Remove coffee and tea stains by flushing the area with vinegar, rinsing and repeating. For wine stains, saturate the spot with vin-

egar and allow it to stand for several minutes. Then, wash as normal. Tip: For more delicate fabrics or precaution, test on an inconspicuous part of the garment first.

Restore yellowed clothing by soaking garments overnight in a solution of 12 parts warm water and one part vinegar. Wash them the following morning.

Soak new garments in a few cups of vinegar for 10-15 minutes before washing to stop dyes from running in the wash.

If frequent ironing has left your iron plate dirty, make a paste from one part vinegar and one part salt to scrub it clean.

Remove scorch marks from an iron by



rubbing it with a warm solution of equal parts vinegar and salt. If that doesn't work, use a cloth dampened with vinegar.

Forgot that you left wet laundry in the machine and it now smells moldy? Pour a few cups of vinegar in the machine and wash the clothes in hot water. Then run a normal cycle with detergent to rinse the clothes.

Prevent lint from clinging to clothes by adding half a cup of vinegar to the wash cycle.





turkey sausage, removed from casing  
 1 cup chopped baby spinach  
 1/2 cup salsa (jarred or Quick Tomato Salsa recipe)  
 2 eggs  
 1/2 avocado, peeled and sliced thinly  
 1/2 cup shredded cheddar cheese  
 1 tablespoon finely chopped cilantro  
 Heat oven to 400 F.  
 Place mushrooms, smooth side up, on baking sheet lined with parchment paper. Bake 10 minutes. Remove from oven and place mushroom caps smooth side up on platter lined with paper towels to drain some of the water.  
 In medium frying pan, heat oil over medium heat. Brown sausage and break into

small pieces with back of wooden spoon while cooking. Stir in spinach and salsa. Transfer mixture to mixing bowl to cool slightly.

Carefully separate egg yolks then place whites in one bowl and yolks in 2 separate small bowls. Beat egg whites with fork.

On baking sheet lined with parchment paper, place mushrooms smooth side down. Place half of avocado slices under mushrooms.

Add egg whites and cheddar cheese to sausage mixture and combine well. Divide mixture in half and stuff into Portobello caps on top of avocado.

For each mushroom, make well in center of sausage mixture large enough for egg yolk.

Bake 10 minutes and carefully pour yolk into each well. Bake until yolks are set, about 5 minutes.

Sprinkle with cilantro before serving.

### Quick Tomato Salsa

1 tomato, cored and diced  
 1 tablespoon finely chopped onion  
 1 tablespoon finely chopped cilantro  
 sprinkle of ground cumin  
 sprinkle of garlic powder

1 lime wedge, juice only  
 salt and pepper, to taste  
 In mixing bowl, combine tomato, onion and cilantro. Season with cumin, garlic, lime juice, salt and pepper, to taste.

 Heat oven to 350 F. Line 8-inch square baking dish with parchment paper.

To make crust, in large bowl, combine almond meal, coconut flour, cinnamon, salt and sweetener. Add melted butter and vanilla extract. Combine all ingredients together and press dough evenly into bottom of baking dish. Bake for 10 minutes, until lightly golden around edges. Remove from oven and set aside.

To make filling, stir coconut flour and sweetener together. Whisk in eggs and lemon juice.

Pour filling into crust and bake 10-15 minutes, until golden around edges.

Let cool at room temperature then refrigerate a minimum of 2 hours before cutting into squares.
