Villages IRS Audit Finished

It has been approximately eight and a half years since the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) advised the Village Center Community Development District and Sumter Landing Community Development District (Districts) it was conducting an audit of its tax exempt bond issues ranging in date from 1998 through 2005. Following notification, the IRS further communicated with the Districts of the issues it considered the basis for advising the Districts they were not qualified issuers of tax exempt bonds.

Over this last eight plus years, the District has spent considerable staff resources and attorney fees in an attempt to help educate the IRS as to the specific facts and information pertaining to the Districts, the State of Florida Chapter 190 providing for special purpose local governments and the Districts' bond issues. Fortunately, the National Association of Bond Lawyers (NABL) eventually took notice of what was transpiring and their organization began additional intense communications with the Internal Revenue Service. As you are aware, the result concurred with what we believed to be the case from the beginning: the Districts were a qualified issuer as a political subdivision under the rules and policies at the time the bonds were issued. NABL agreed with the Districts that the IRS could not change the rules subsequent to tax exempt bonds being issued and then retroactively apply new rules.

Following notification by the IRS that the bonds were no longer being examined for political subdivision concerns, the IRS raised questions about the tax exempt status because they believed the bonds to be private activity bonds. Again, the Districts responded stating the IRS was incorrect and although the IRS continued to state their position, the Districts were prepared to continue through due process to resolve the issue in their favor.

However, during the course of the audits, the Districts did, in fact, refund the tax ex-

Mosquito-Borne Zika Cases

Gov. Scott: With Likely Mosquito-Borne Zika Cases, State Will Use Full Resources to Protect Floridians

ORLANDO, Fla. – Today, Governor Rick Scott announced that the Florida Department of Health (DOH) has concluded that four cases of the Zika virus are likely mosquito-borne. DOH knows that the four cases are in Miami-Dade and Broward Counties. One of these cases involves a woman and the other three cases involve men. At this time, DOH believes that active transmissions of the Zika virus are occurring in one small area in Miami-Dade County, just north of downtown. The exact location is within the boundaries of the following area: NW 5th Avenue to the west, US 1 to the east, NW/NE 38th Street to the north and NW/NE 20th Street to the south. This area is about 1 square mile and a map is below to detail the area. This is currently the only area of the state where DOH is testing to see if there are local transmissions of Zika. They are all active Zika cases and have not exhibited symptoms to be admitted to the hospital.

Governor Scott said, “We learned today that four people in our state likely have the

Zika virus as a result of a mosquito bite. All four of these people live in Miami-Dade and Broward Counties and the Florida Department of Health believes that active transmissions of this virus could be occurring in one small area in Miami. While no mosquitoes have tested positive for the Zika virus, DOH is aggressively testing people in this area to ensure there are no other cases. If you live in this area and want to be tested, I urge you to contact the county health department which stands ready to assist you.

“Since our first travel-related case in February, Florida has taken an aggressive approach and committed state and local resources to combat this virus. Just like with a hurricane, we have worked hard to stay ahead of the spread of Zika and prepare for the worst, even as we hope for the best. Now that Florida has become the first state to have a local transmission, likely through a mosquito, we will continue to put every resource available to fighting the spread of Zika in our state. Last month, I used my emergency executive authority to allocate \$26.2 million in state funds for Zika pre-

I wanted to make everyone aware of a proposed rate increase for workers comp. NCCI (National Council on Compensation Insurance) has filed for a 19.6% increase to be effective Oct. 1.

Per The Florida Chamber of Commerce "The recommended 19.6 percent workers' comp rate increase, proposed effective beginning October 1, was announced earlier today by the National Council on Compensation Insurance (NCCI,) the industry's provider of workers' comp analysis and rates. The increase results from two recent

Florida Supreme Court rulings that deemed Florida's attorney fee provision unconstitutional (Castellanos v. Next Door Company), and declared the current cap for temporary total disability (104 weeks) unconstitutional (Westphal v. City of St. Petersburg).

According to the release by NCCI, "NCCI estimates that the impact of Westphal will be an increase in overall Florida workers compensation system costs of +2.2%." If the rate filing is approved as filed increasing rates by 19.6 percent, Florida will have the highest premiums in the Southeast."



Despite enduring this unimaginable trauma, Jeff is a survivor. In America, there is a safety net. Everyone matters. The abusive parents had a history of substance abuse and were ultimately convicted of child abuse, the ultimate domestic violence.

Today Jeff is 29. He has not only survived, but thrived. Jeff graduated from the Deaf and Blind school in St. Augustine. He reads braille, operates a voice iPhone, plays guitar and piano, rides a bike, and drives a lawn tractor. "Ginette and I can never fully explain what this child has added to our lives. Jeff is an amazing encourager," says Dennis.

The Baxley's have adult guardianship for Jeff. He lives a full life and is a productive member of the community. He works at Kenny's Place Plant Nursery, vacuums cars, and rolls silverware for Mojo's Restaurant. Everyone has challenges, but Jeff

inspires us to see domestic violence can be overcome and everyone deserves a chance to fulfill their God given potential. We live one blessed life together.

empt bonds with taxable bonds: securing a substantial savings due to market changes since the original bonds were issued. The decision by the Districts to refund the bonds was to take advantage of the low interest market available - not knowing how long the savings would be available while waiting for the IRS to complete its audits.

Although the IRS still believes the original bonds should have been taxable, and the

Districts still believe the IRS analysis and position were incorrect, on July 14, 2016 the Districts received letters from the IRS that state: "You have notified us that all of the Bonds were redeemed on (Dates differ). We have concluded that closing the examination without further IRS action supports sound tax administration." The closed examination applies to all tax exempt Recreational Revenue Bonds issued by the Village Center Community Development District and the Sumter Landing Community Development District.

This process has been a very long, frustrating and, due to inaccurate media coverage, an anxious one for some of our residents. However, from the beginning, the Districts (Supervisors and Staff) have assured residents of the Districts' financial strength and that the process/outcome would not adversely affect the provision of amenity services or have any impact on Amenity Fees. We remain committed to residents' expectations regarding the provision of Amenity services and want to reassure all residents of the Districts' commitment and the model which provides sustainability of The Villages community. For over 8 years we were steadfast in maintaining that the Districts had followed the law and that there was no factual basis for the IRS examination. To have this examination finally closed without penalty is a tremendous victory for our community and vindication of our Supervisors and District staff who do a tremendous job serving our residents.

Thank you to the Supervisors for your support and perseverance in seeing this audit to its conclusion. Please let me know if you have any questions or need further clarifications.

Five Steps Toward Better Battery Behavior

(NAPS)—Here's hot news about your car battery that may seem surprising: It's not so much the cold that gets it down as it is high heat.

Heat causes battery fluid to evaporate, thus damaging the internal structure of the battery. That's why it's a good idea to check your battery as the seasons change from hotter to cooler or if you've been driving in a hot part of the country.

Here's what else to do about your battery. Battery Batters

Another reason for shortened battery life is overcharging. That is, a malfunctioning component in the charging system, usually the voltage regulator, can allow too high a charging rate, leading to slow death for a

battery, explained Rich White, executive director, Car Care Council.

In addition, colder temperatures can increase the thickness of the engine oil, making the engine harder to turn over, causing the battery to have to work more. These factors lead to harder starting.



What You Can Do

To get the most life out of a battery, the Car Care Council suggests the following simple steps:

- Be sure the electrical system is charging at the correct rate; overcharging can damage a battery as quickly as undercharging.
- If your battery is the type that needs to be topped off, check it regularly. Add distilled water when necessary.
- Always replace a battery with one that's rated at least as high as the one originally specified.
- Have the battery checked if you notice headlights and interior lights dim, accessories that fail to operate, or the "check engine" or battery light illuminated.
- Keep the top of the battery clean. Dirt becomes a conductor, which drains battery power. Further, as corrosion accumulates on battery terminals, it becomes an insulator, inhibiting current flow.

When Is Wearing Headphones or Earphones Against Florida Law?

Wearing a headset, earphones or headphones can contribute to car crashes.

Although it is not against Florida law to walk with headphones on, it is against the law to drive a vehicle or ride a bicycle while wearing a headset, earphones, headphones or other listening device. Florida Statute 316.304 states that no person shall operate a vehicle while wearing a headset,

headphone, or other listening device, other than a hearing aid or instrument for the improvement of defective human hearing. There are a few exceptions that include a motorcyclist using a headset that is installed in a helmet and worn so as to prevent the speakers from making direct contact with the user's ears so that the user can hear surrounding sounds and any person using a headset in conjunction with a cellular telephone that only provides sound through one ear and allows surrounding sounds to be heard with the other ear.

Some people may argue that this law only pertains to "vehicles." However, it is important to know how Florida law defines "vehicles." Under Florida Statute 316.003(75)

a "vehicle" is defined as "every device, in, upon, or by which any person or property is or may be transported or drawn upon a highway, excepting devices used exclusively upon stationary rails or tracks." In this same law, a bicycle is defined as "every vehicle propelled solely by human power, and every motorized bicycle propelled by a combination of human power and an electric helper motor . . ."

A violation of this section of the law is a


noncriminal traffic infraction, punishable as a nonmoving violation.

So, follow the law and don't wear earphones while driving a car or riding a bike. Not only is it illegal, it is not smart. If those tunes drown out the drone of the unseen semi truck bearing down on you, serious injury or death can result.

Baxley to File Blue Lives Matter

Belleview, Fla. — Florida Senate candidate Dennis Baxley announced plans to file the Blue Lives Matter Act in the 2017 Legislative Session. The act would alter Florida's definition of a hate crime to include law enforcement officers and firefighters. The announcement comes in the wake of the recent deadly attack on police officers in Dallas. State Representative Neil Combee plans to file the companion bill in the Florida House.

"The recent attack that took the lives of five Dallas police officers who were protecting the rights of citizens to exercise their right to peaceful assembly is absolutely despicable," said Baxley. "Our hearts break for their families and for that community.

This tragedy hardens my resolve to fight the dangerous and growing disdain for law enforcement that is seeping into our culture. In the Florida Senate, I will do everything in my power to protect them, equip them, and honor their service."

The legislation will be modeled on a Louisiana law that will take effect on August 1. The Louisiana bill was passed this year as a response to a string of riots and deaths involving police, most notably in Ferguson, Missouri following the death of Michael Brown in 2014.

Baxley is seeking the District 12 seat in the Florida Senate, which includes southern Marion, Lake, and Sumter Counties. He currently holds the District 23 seat in the Florida House.



paredness, prevention and response in Florida. I will continue to travel the state and speak with local leaders, ports and airports to ensure their needs are met. If it becomes

clear more resources are needed, we will not hesitate to allocate them.

“We know this virus is most detrimental to expecting mothers. If you are pregnant or thinking of becoming pregnant and live in

the impacted area, I urge you to contact your OB/GYN for guidance and to receive a Zika Prevention kit. I also ask every Floridian to take proper precautions by eliminating any standing water and wearing insect repellent.

“Following today’s news, I directed the Department of Health to immediately begin contracting with commercial pest control companies to increase spraying and mosquito abatement efforts in the impacted area. We know from our experience with successfully dealing with other mosquito-borne viruses in our state that through constant surveillance and immediate action that we will protect our families and visitors. We will continue this same approach as we work to combat the Zika virus in our state. Florida is an outdoors state with pristine beaches, award-winning state parks and world class fishing. We continue to welcome record visitors to Florida and will remind everyone

in our state to take proper precautions and wear insect repellent.”

Governor Scott has directed DOH to activate the Joint Information Center (JIC) within the State Emergency Operations Center to ensure impacted areas have coordinated access to information and resources. As part of this effort, Governor Scott has directed DOH to contract with commercial pest control companies to enhance and expand mosquito mitigation and abatement, including increased spraying, in the impacted areas.

Governor Scott has also directed DOH to do the following response activities:

Provide \$620,000 to OneBlood, the primary blood bank in the area, to establish appropriate blood screening. DOH will be working with FDA and blood establishments in Miami-Dade and Broward Counties to test each individual unit of blood collected. Additionally, statewide DOH will ensure safe blood for pregnant women by screening units from counties without Zika.

Work with the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services to issue a Mosquito Declaration and ensure that Mosquito Control in the areas of concern have the resources they need to combat further local transmission. Miami-Dade and Broward County Mosquito Control Districts will receive \$1.28 million in state funds through December to combat Zika.

Continue investigations in concert with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention to ensure we learn all we can about Zika as an emerging disease.

Coordinate with OB/GYNs and organizations that serve pregnant woman in the impacted area to distribute Zika prevention kits to pregnant women.

Ongoing door-to-door outreach in the areas of concern with continued mosquito mitigation activities and repellent distribution.

Partner with VISIT FLORIDA to distribute educational items, repellent and Zika Prevention Kits for pregnant women to visitor centers in the impacted areas.

Partner with the Florida Department of Education to ensure that mosquito breeding source reduction and mitigation activities have occurred at all schools in Miami-Dade and Broward counties ahead of children returning to classes this fall.

Commissioner of Agriculture and Consumer Services Adam H. Putnam said, “We are dedicated to protecting Floridians and visitors from Zika and will continue to support mosquito control programs throughout Florida with their surveillance and control efforts. Floridians can do their part by draining standing water surrounding their homes, as it can serve as breeding grounds for the mosquitoes that are capable of transmitting the virus.”

Florida Surgeon General Dr. Celeste Philip said, “As with most emerging health threats, we learn more about Zika each day but we recognize that the unknown can be scary especially for pregnant women. We’re committed to sharing as much as we can as soon as we can. Our top priority is the safety and well-being of all people in Florida and a big part of that is being accessible. 

WHY: According to Bils, bright lights and binge watching TV or movies can decrease the sleep hormone melatonin and keep your mind from relaxing.

- **Maintain sleep schedules through vacations:** Even when traveling, try to keep your normal sleep schedule. That will help you stay alert and active on the road.

WHY: "Altering your sleep schedule actually creates jet lag-like symptoms, which affects your motor skills, concentration, mood and health," Bils noted.

- **Consider a warm-weather wardrobe for your room.** Ensure your comforters are light and breathable so you sleep comfort-

ably all night long. And take advantage of the latest high-tech solutions: Sleep Number offers a DualTemp™ layer that you can add to any mattress to heat and cool each side, so you can both have it the way you like.

WHY: Just as you have winter and summer jackets, you should have blankets that vary in warmth for different seasons. Body heat is released through your feet, head and

Family Caregivers Don't Have To Feel Alone
